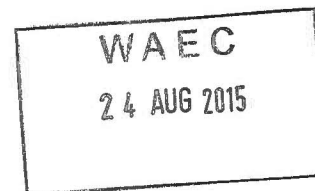

Dear Commissioners,

Please see attached the signatures and comments by the 523 concerned people who signed my petition to stop you as commissioners taking away a regional seat in WA.

I am so frustrated and anyone living, working or investing in regional WA should be too - no matter what your political stripes may be!

Your report recommends to abolish a regional seat and create a new seat in Perth's southern suburbs.

This is completely unacceptable and will mean less political representation for people living in a regional electorate.

If regional WA loses a seat, this will mean a poorer focus on essential services like education, health and transport in our regions, not to mention the devastating social impacts it will have on regional communities. WA's economy isn't going to be made in our metropolitan suburbs or on the Kwinana freeway, it's developed in our precious regions.

Outlined are my concerns:

#### Proposal One:

Under this proposal, Roe will have around 28,323 voters and have an area of around 89,370 km<sup>2</sup> this would mean that Roe will have a VFADE of around 13.64% which is definitely ridiculous. However, we might scrutinise two variants of this key minimum boundary change proposal so that it might stand to scrutiny when proposed to the electoral distribution commissioners.

#### Proposal One:

This much more modest proposal from the original proposal would mean that the seat of Roe would have around 26,122 voters, a VFADE of around 4.81% which is a sensible amount, it's area of around 84,274 km<sup>2</sup> is also far enough from large district status to be palatable to the electoral commissioners. Retaining of these strong National voting shires would strengthen the safest (on paper) seat for the Nationals in Western Australia. For the electorate of Central Wheatbelt of this minimal change proposal will be that Central Wheatbelt will have around 24,531 voters (-1.57% VFADE) and around 97,853 km<sup>2</sup>, including Wongan-Ballidu would tip Central Wheatbelt over the 100,000 km<sup>2</sup> large district limit so to maintain minimum change and to keep Moore from the dangerous tipping point of -4.13% VFADE it would be tolerable to accept the transfer of Wongan-Ballidu to Moore.

#### Proposal Three:

There are three main arguments for the commissioners to shift the shire of Jerramungup from Roe to Albany:

1. As is mentioned in the Proposed Boundaries report by the EDCs : “The Commissioners understand that residents in the Shire of Jerramungup generally regard Albany as their regional centre and as the district of Albany already includes areas where the land use is agricultural (as well as the town centre) there ought not to be any adverse community of interest implications.
2. Albany in the current boundaries has 4312km<sup>2</sup>, while Jerramungup has 6,507.1 km<sup>2</sup>. While this might sound like an argument against the inclusion of the shire in the electorate of Albany I can suggest that by “spreading the territory” it would help ease the pressure on the incoming MLA of Roe if the responsibility for that territory is given to Albany
3. Retaining Jerramungup in Roe would make an already safe National seat (on paper, the “safest”) even more safe. However, as the Vasse by-election has shown a grassroots campaign with a “local champion” can make serious inroads into regional cities like Albany and by including the Shire of Jerramungup into Albany it would prove immeasurable should the Liberals fall into third place.

#### Electoral Reform Proposals

The following is a table illustrating the increase in the Average District Enrolment over the past two redistributions:

Thus a key argument we can make to convince representatives of metropolitan Perth to take up reform is to illustrate that the old model of a fixed number of representatives to a floating ADE is not only creating the situation where a country seat needs to be removed despite increased enrolment but is also affecting the amount of electors that need to be serviced by MLAs all-around.

#### Potential Electoral Reform Ideas:

- Floating number of seats: set 21,350 voters (the same as 2007) as the ADE and float the total number of seats to ensure a minimum level of representation. Regional representation is assured for the meantime since the enrolment of regional Western Australia has not decreased. It would also mean around 10 extra seats would have been created since 2007. That obvious consequence could be minimised with certain provisions but the biggest argument for this principle is that it would make the decision about the distribution of districts between the regions and Perth less a political decision and mostly mechanical (taking into account LDA)

- New Zealand Apportionment system: set a base standard of 16 MPs as an agreed minimum standard of representation for the geographically sparse and large south island and float the total number of electorate MPs accordingly. In the WA context it would be 17 MLAs for the regions and the total number of MLA's for Perth as:

Or a nuanced variant of the above. This would also achieve the same results as floating the total number of seats in a roundabout way

- Canadian Variation: “Nobody gets left behind” provinces can never lose representation, only gain them. In the case of WA that would mean that while Eyre is retained, probably around 3 electorates would be added into the metropolitan region, probably given to all the three Metropolitan regions equally. The obvious flaw is that it eventually gets into a situation where one-vote-one-value is distorted to the point where it becomes politically

toxic.

The Irish- Singaporean leeway: the election commission is given huge leeway and the variation is only a guide...this will mean that electorates like North-West Central and Eyre can be tolerated because of their special circumstances. This would allow significant communities of interest to exist and tolerated with very minimum boundary changes but it would be difficult to justify if the media decides to make it an issue.

Please take these concerns and ensure regional WA is not damaged or hindered in your process!
